## II. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF THE AUGUST 31, 2022, BENEFITS AND SERVICES COMMITTEE MEETING – OPEN SESSION (Item 2)</u>

## III. SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION ON THE TRIENNIAL HEALTH BENEFITS STUDY (Item 3)

The committee received a presentation from Mr. Buffalo regarding the supplemental results from the Triennial Health Benefits Study. The committee learned that the percentage of employers providing health insurance coverage for full-time equivalent positions has remained consistent over the last five years. The committee heard about the affordability of private health insurance premiums for elder retired women and received information about the costs for retirees who rely on Medicare. The committee discussed coverage for community college faculty and learned that full-time faculty find it easier to afford coverage as compared to part-time faculty and faculty with multiple part-time assignments. The committee encouraged informing members of health care costs early in their career and inquired about long-term care costs.

### IV. LUMP SUM DEATH BENFIT ANALYSIS (Item 4)

The committee received a presentation from Mr. Buffalo, Mr. Reed, and Mr. Lamoureux regarding the one-time death benefit. The committee received information about the origin, history, and possible purposes of the benefit. The committee learned that existing benefit levels adequately cover the costs associated with end-of-life related expenses for most members. The committee inquired about the death benefit provided by other state retirement systems and learned that survivors of CalSTRS members may receive both the death benefit and a monthly benefit. The committee requested additional information on increasing the lump sum death benefit based on inflation in California in the previous calendar year and the funded status of the Defined Benefit Program to provide guidance on potential future benefit adjustments.

# V. <u>FOCUSING ON THE CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE: NOW AND INTO THE FUTURE (Item 5)</u>

The committee received a presentation from Ms. LeBlanc on the member experience when interacting with CalSTRS for benefits planning and education services. The committee learned about the evolution of member services and the current operating model for retirement readiness, including benefit planning services and educational offerings provided through multiple channels. The committee heard about scheduled member outreach events for 2023 and expressed its appreciation for moving the Santa Clara Member Service Center to Oakland. The committee discussed the importance of engaging members at the start of their careers.

The committee heard from Mr. Goldberg, Mr. Foglia, Mr. Welch, and Mr. Orr, all of whom emphasized the importance of engaging members at the start of their careers.

### VI. REVIEW INFORMATION REQUESTS (Item 6)

Pursuant to item 3, the committee requested information on long-term care costs. Pursuant to item 4, the committee requested additional information on increasing the lump sum death benefit based on inflation in California in the previous calendar year and the funded status of the Defined Benefit Program. Pursuant to item 5, the committee requested information on reaching members to ensure they are responsive to CalSTRS communications.
