Item Purpose

The purpose of the item is to initiate the process to conduct the 2023 election of active members and participants to the Board by adopting a Notice of Election.

Recommendation

CalSTRS staff recommends the board approve the attached resolution to adopt the Notice of Election announcing the 2023 Election of Active Employee Members to the Teachers’ Retirement Board. As part of the Notice of Election, CalSTRS staff also recommends the board approve a requirement that one must obtain 250 signatures to qualify as a candidate, consistent with past elections.

Executive Summary

In the fall of 2023, pursuant to Section 22200 and 22200.5 of the Education Code, CalSTRS will be conducting the sixth election of three members of the Board who represent active CalSTRS members and participants. The four-year terms of those elected in 2023 will begin on January 1, 2024.

Regulations concerning the election require CalSTRS to issue a Notice of Election to members announcing the nomination and election period, information on eligibility and the nomination process, as well as guidelines on qualifications for becoming a candidate. CalSTRS will post the

Notice of Election adopted by the board on CalSTRS.com and include it in the upcoming CalSTRS Connections—the CalSTRS publication mailed to active Defined Benefit members and Cash Balance Benefit participants.

The draft Notice of Election requires candidates to collect 250 signatures of active members or participants to qualify as a candidate. CalSTRS recently surveyed six retirement systems from around the country to determine a reasonable signature requirement that ensures a potential candidate has a sufficient base of support but is not consumed with the task of collecting signatures. The average number of signatures required to qualify for the ballot was 270, with a low of 20 for Fairfax County Retirement System (Virginia) and a high of 500 for both of the public retirement systems in Ohio. CalSTRS has required 250 signatures in all five past elections. Staff recommends keeping the signature requirement at the current number, as it represents a serious base of support, but not so large that it is overly burdensome.

The Candidate Information Packet (Attachment 1) includes the draft Notice of Election, which is similar to that adopted in previous elections and is consistent with existing regulations.

Background

The CalSTRS Teachers' Retirement Board is comprised of 12 members. Three of its members are elected by and represent active CalSTRS members and participants. The three elected members are designated as follows:

- A Pre K-12 or County Office of Education employee who is an active CalSTRS Defined Benefit member or Cash Balance Benefit participant. This person cannot be an administrator.
 - Elected by: All Pre K-12 and COE employees who are active CalSTRS Defined Benefit members or Cash Balance Benefit participants.
- A Pre K-12 or County Office of Education employee who is an active CalSTRS Defined Benefit Program member or active Cash Balance Benefit participant, including administrators.
 - Elected by: All Pre K-12 and COE employees who are active CalSTRS Defined Benefit members or Cash Balance Benefit participants.
- A community college instructor who is an active Defined Benefit member or Cash Balance participant
 - Elected by: Active CalSTRS Defined Benefit members or Cash Balance Benefit participants who are employed by a community college.

The Board adopted regulations (CCR section 24000–24009) regarding elections in 2003 and amended these regulations in 2009 (included in the attachment 1 – 2023 Teachers' Retirement Board Candidate Information Packet). In advance of each election, regulations require the Board adopt and distribute the Notice of Election—containing candidate nomination and election guidelines, eligibility criteria for candidates and voters, how to obtain candidate nomination packets from CalSTRS, and the schedule of events.

CalSTRS will provide the Candidate Information Packet electronically on our website, consistent with regulations and past practices. Should a candidate wish to receive a hard copy, the Election Coordinator will provide it upon request.

CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION REPORTING

Candidates for the Teachers' Retirement Board election are subject to certain filing and reporting requirements under the Political Reform Act of 1974 found at Government Code section 81000 et seq. The Political Reform Act is administered and enforced by the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC).

The election packet mailed to individuals requesting information, as well as the Board Election site on CalSTRS.com, will contain a contact phone number and a link to the FPPC. Once the qualified candidates are announced by the Elections Coordinator, the FPPC will create a filing schedule for candidates that will provide filing deadlines based on the election schedule.
