SUBJECT: Employer Directive 2001-08
Medicare Division – Report of Completed Medicare Division Results

PURPOSE

Chapter 1032, Statutes of 2000 (Senate Bill 1435—Johnston) establishes the Medicare Benefits (MB) Program effective January 1, 2001. The California State Teachers' Retirement System's (CalSTRS) MB Program will pay the Medicare Part A (hospitalization) premium for those eligible Defined Benefit (DB) Program members currently retired who are not eligible to receive Medicare Part A benefits without payment of a premium. For DB Program members retiring on or after January 1, 2001, eligibility for the program is dependent on the Teachers' Retirement Board (Board) extending eligibility for the MB Program to those members providing those members retire from districts that have completed or are in the process of completing a Medicare Division. If the Board extends the MB Program, DB Program members who retire from school districts that have not yet completed a Medicare Division will not be eligible for the MB Program.

SCOPE

This directive applies to all school districts that have not completed a Medicare Division resulting in a federal approval date prior to January 1, 2001. Districts that have not yet completed a Division are listed on Attachment 1. If your district is not on the attached list, you do not have to take any additional action to make your employees who are DB Program members eligible for the MB program if the Board extends the benefit program. Districts that CalSTRS understands is conducting the Division are indicated on Attachment 2. Furthermore, if your district does not have any employees who are DB Program members that were hired prior to April 1, 1986, or the district and all employees are paying Medicare tax, you do not have to take additional action.

DISCUSSION

Present Program

The MB program is currently limited to CalSTRS' Defined Benefit (DB) Program members who retired prior to January 1, 2001, and who meet specified criteria. For information on benefit eligibility, please see Employer Information Circular Volume 17, Issue 6 dated April 4, 2001.

Program Eligibility for Future Retired Members of the DB Program

The Board has the authority to extend eligibility for the MB Program to CalSTRS DB Program members who retire on or after January 1, 2001. The Board will decide during the 2nd quarter of 2001 whether to extend this benefit. Information regarding the extension of the coverage to members who retire in 2001 or later will be provided to members in the CalSTRS *Bulletin* and on the CalSTRS website at www.calstrs.ca.gov. If the coverage is extended, CalSTRS will also issue an Employer Information Circular and send an information packet to all DB Program members who may be eligible.

As indicated above, if the Board extends the program, eligibility is limited to CalSTRS DB Program members who retire on or after January 1, 2001, from a school district that has completed or is in the process of conducting a Medicare Division prior to the members' retirement date. Therefore, unless school districts conduct a Division prior to the members' retirement, members retiring from those districts **will not be eligible** for benefits under the CalSTRS MB Program if the program is extended.

Medicare Division of State Teachers

Eligibility for premium-free Medicare Part A is provided to people who earned at least 40 credits by paying the 1.45 percent Medicare payroll tax (with an equal amount paid by the employer) generally for at least 10 years. CalSTRS DB Program members, who were hired by their current school district before April 1, 1986, were not required to pay Medicare payroll tax. (In contrast, those hired after April 1, 1986, were required to pay Medicare payroll tax.) Federal law, subsequently incorporated in the California Government Code, permits a school employer to request that employees hired before April 1, 1986, be divided into two groups—members who desire to be covered by Medicare and those who do not desire such coverage. That is why the action is called a Division. (Under current state law, school districts will not be able to initiate this process after June 30, 2004.) During the Medicare Division process eligible employees hired prior to April 1, 1986, will make an irrevocable individual choice whether or not to be covered in Medicare. For those members who elect to be covered by Medicare, they and their employer will pay the payroll tax and the employees will earn Medicare credits. If the member was less than age 58 at the time of the Division, the member must choose to be covered by Medicare at the time of the Division (and pay the associated payroll tax) to be eligible for the CalSTRS MB program.

California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) administers the Division process. School districts interested in conducting a Division need to contact CalPERS.

A school district interested in entering into an agreement for Medicare coverage of its members must adopt a resolution and return it with a completed questionnaire to the CalPERS Teachers' Medicare Services. This Division and election process will usually take 12 to 18 months to complete.

During the Medicare Division, the district's governing body designates an individual to act as Local Division Officer throughout the process. This individual serves as a public agency contact with all correspondence to and from the CalPERS Teachers' Medicare Services. This officer will prepare a certified list of persons who were eligible to receive Division ballots and indicate thereon the choice made by each individual. This report is needed to identify which CalSTRS members, who retire on or after January 1, 2001, will be eligible for the CalSTRS MB Program, if the Board extends eligibility to this group.

Completed Division

The Medicare Division process is completed when all required Division documents and ballots are returned to CalPERS and federal approval has been granted.

The actual Division is conducted during a 10-day election period specified by the district in which eligible employees make an irrevocable decision whether to be covered by Medicare. To be eligible for the CalSTRS MB Program (assuming the Board extends eligibility) when they retire, active DB Program members who are less than age 58 at the time of the 10-day election period are required to elect to be covered by Medicare. Active DB Program members age 58 or older, whose school district is in the process of conducting the Division, are not required to elect to be covered by Medicare during the 10-day election period. However, the DB Program member must retire during or after this 10-day period to satisfy the eligibility requirement of the CalSTRS MB Program. That is, a member age 58 or older can choose not be covered by Medicare and still qualify for the MB Program benefits. In both cases, the school district must receive federal approval related to that election. In addition, the Board must extend eligibility to members retiring on or after January 1, 2001, for this type of member to receive the MB Program benefit.

The following examples are provided to show possible impacts on an employee's decision during a Division election.

Example #1: Mrs. Smith is deciding whether to retire. She does not have enough Medicare credits from her employment or from a spouse to be eligible for Medicare Part A without payment of premium when she turns 65. The district from which she is retiring must conduct a Medicare Division prior to her retirement and that Division must result in federal approval in order for her to be eligible to have CalSTRS pay her Medicare Part A premiums. If Mrs. Smith is less than age 58, she must agree to be covered by Medicare in order to be eligible for the CalSTRS MB Program. If she is age 58 or older at the time of the 10-day election, her individual decision in the election will not affect her eligibility for the CalSTRS MB Program. In either case, to satisfy the district eligibility requirements of the CalSTRS MB Program, she must retire no sooner than the 10-day election period.

Example #2: If Mrs. Smith retires after the 10-day election period and her district fails to get federal approval or the election is redone after her retirement date, she will not be eligible for the CalSTRS MB Program.

In either example, all of the following would have to occur in order for CalSTRS to pay the member's Medicare Part A premiums:

- The school district is granted federal approval for completing the Medicare Division process;
- The Board extends coverage of the CalSTRS MB Program to members who retire during a specified period and the member retires during that period;
- The member enrolls in Medicare Part A and Part B at age 65;
- Medicare charges the member a premium for Medicare Part A; and,
- The member signs and returns the appropriate documents to CalSTRS.

ACTION

If the Board extends eligibility for the CalSTRS MB Program to members who retire on or after January 1, 2001, CalSTRS must receive notification from CalPERS, or the school district, that the Division has been finalized before CalSTRS retired members who were employed by that district can be considered eligible for the MB Program.

Districts that complete the Division process after January 1, 2001, **are required to** send CalSTRS a copy of the certified list that is sent to CalPERS Teachers' Medicare Services indicating how each CalSTRS DB Program member voted. Please send the list to the address below:
